And she mentioned in there that U.S. officials I forget what department it is that currency, when they're studying the currency, they can't possibly study all of the counterfeits. They can't know all the counterfeit. So what they do is they spend all of their time focused on the truth.

Mm hmm. Currently, yeah. And they know that you currency so that when they come up against something that isn't the true currency, they know that it's not the true. Because they know what the truth is and all the ins and outs of it. And the more that we spend in the word and in study of the word, we're able to come against those false reflections as false truths, because we can't possibly know all of them, but we can know the truth and we can compare those false things to the truth.

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Yes, I'm even Paul in in his letters, the epistles. He was constantly warning the churches against false teaching, against false religion, against false worship, so many different things that he was constantly encouraging them to be aware of because they were bombarding it. Oh, and we just we definitely see that as an issue throughout. It's so important to be clear on what is true. And the only way to do that is to be in the word and to know know what the truth is so we can share the gospel. The good news with others effectively. Yeah.

And living captivated by Christ allows us to do that right when we aren't distracted by every other little shiny thing that comes along.

You know who taught you and how from embassy, you have known the holy writings which are able to give you wisdom for salvation through faith in Jesus Christ.

Hmm. He's. He's telling them no. The true thing. You know, the one thing focus on the one thing that you were taught and not all the other things that the world is throwing at you.

Another aspect that we talked about with Darrell was the persecution and the incorrect theology. Right. That the Catholic Church there in Honduras has. Right. Of how they have to pay they pay the church. They pay the the priests. And if they don't, they're told they're not going to heaven.

Chapter two Verse one says, I will stand at my watch post. I will remain stationed on the city wall. Israel had divided, like we talked about with Hosea a few weeks ago, into two nations, Israel and Judah.

Israel was conquered by the Assyrians and sometime in between that conquering and when Habakkuk wrote this book, God told him the nation of Judah is still not turning back to me. And because of that, I'm going to empower the Babylonians, which is another powerful nation that came in, and they're going to come in and they're going to wipe you out.

They're going to carry you off into exile. And so Habakkuk is complaining to the Lord of all the sin that's happening in the nation. He's saying, look at all these false things that are happening,

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all the idolatry that they're worshiping, everything that I see in our world today. It's like in chapter one, reading out the violence and the depravity and the greed and all of the things that Habakkuk is complaining about or things that you could turn on the news and see today.

And that interesting is it was this was so many years ago, thousands of years ago was and so is

In this God is is telling him, okay, I'm going to I'm going to provide I'm going to I'm going to take care. But I'm going to do it by sending this nation. I'm going to empower them. Evil, evil, evil nation. Very evil Babylon, very cruel. But I'm going to let them come in and I'm going to let them carry you off into exile, and I'm going to deliver you that way.

Okay.

So Habakkuk had a change of heart. He changed position in chapter two, verse one, and he says, I'm going to go sit in my watchtower, and I'm going to wait and keep watch. I'm going to wait, and I'm going to keep watch for the besorah, for the good news.

News, good news.

I'm going to keep looking. And you don't really understand the significance of that until you understand culturally what a watchtower is and what a runner with the besorah did. So in that time period, Watchtowers were stationed and built around the edges of the city so that they could see and they could see the whole valley. They could see the hills around them.

They could see the roads coming in and out, and they could see if there was someone attacking. They could see if someone was coming with a message. They just kept watch. Always to watch for for the news. Whatever news. Good news. Bad news. And if if a nation was at war, they would send a runner with the besorah. The good news if they won, they would send it back to the city so that the king or the city would know that, hey, we've won, we've won the battle. And Habakkuk was saying, I'm going to sit in the watchtower, and I'm going to watch for the good news. I'm going to watch for the besorah that God is going to provide.

I'm going to watch for the salvation and the deliverance that he is going to bring for his people. And he's doing that so that he can tell the people the good news. He can tell the people around him the good news of the Lord, which is such a beautiful picture, that he he changed his posture. He changed his position to wait on the Lord.

He first recognize what was going on with the sin, but then He changed his posture and position to wait. And while he did that, I would be tempted if it were me to complain. And then, God the Son is the besorah, to redeem and to restore his people. John 1:29 tells us He's the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

So this is what you've just shown to us is a beautiful picture of the gospel. It's not the gospel, as we see it in the New Testament book is that we're talking about Jesus coming. But it's a picture of that.
